The Illinois Public Pension Advisory Committee was created in 1995 by concerned Police and Fire Pension Fund Trustees who wanted to be kept up-to-date on issues affecting public pension funds in Illinois. IPPAC is an Illinois not-for-profit corporation. All police and fire pension funds in Illinois may become members.
